

RESOLUTION V – REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN

THEME: AGENDA 2030 FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

CONCERN: GRETACT – DECLARATION OF THE URGENT STATE OF CLIMATE

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

- Afflicted by the fact that the world's median temperature has augmented by 0,85°C between 1880 and 2012 due to human activity, as shown by the Groupe intergouvernemental d'experts sur l'évolution du Climat (GIEC),
- Noting that numerous countries aren't making enough efforts in order to come to terms with global warming,
- Alarmed by the fact that an increase of only 1,5°C would mean, amongst other consequences, the rise of sea levels and the inhabitability of huge coastal regions, as well as a lack of water and the shift of more than 100 million people into poverty and malnutrition by 2080,
- Underlining that the current measures, notably those required by the Paris Agreement, and that the few plausible personal measures are not sufficient enough to counter the effects of global warming,
- Preoccupied by the realization that the climate issue is not only a meteorological but also an economical, ecological and safety issue, it is thus also a key element in maintaining world peace,
- Regretting that the world Bank estimates that during the next 30 years, the number of climate refugees will reach more than 140 million,
- Outraged that none of the United Nations' 2019 resolutions, including those from the ECOSOC, as well as those by the security council and those of the 74e annual session do not deal with the issue of "climate change",
- Decides the change of the UN's principal mandate from "Maintain International Peace and Security" to "Put a Term to Global Warming and its Consequences" in order to update.
