

RESOLUTION XI – CANADA

THEME: POLITICAL AND SOCIAL RIGHTS

CONCERN: THE DECRIMINALIZATION OF HOMOSEXUALITY WHICH ULTIMATELY LEADS THE
LEGALIZATION OF GAY CIVIL MARRIAGE

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

- Shocked the by violence of the words and actions inflicted on people homosexuals, escaping all consideration of human dignity,
- Deploring the inequality of their rights due to their sexual orientation, including oppressive, frightening and deadly acts like discrimination hiring, defamation and attacks on honor, precariousness, suicide, tortures, traumatic conversion therapies,
- Outraged by the fact that 8 countries still condemn to death homosexuality, that 80% of young homosexuals lead a double life and hide, and that 50% of LGBT + are victims of homophobic attacks,
- Recalling that, according to the Declaration of Human Rights: "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights ", that about 3% of the population is homosexual (about 200 million people), and that homosexuality is natural and present in more than 450 animal species,
- Arguing that a society condemning homophobic acts would be more just, more peaceful, and safer, and that a State must guarantee to all their fundamentals rights,
- Decides to tend towards a penalization of any homophobic act;
- that all countries recognize the need for decriminalization of homosexual;
 - to encourage states to recognize same-sex civil marriage.
