

Resolution presented by the delegation of

Gambia

Theme Sustainable Development

Concern (extreme) food shortage in Africa's LEDCs

the General Assembly,

Noting that Africa's less economically developed countries (LEDCs) are expecting a tremendous population increase from an estimated 140 million in 1900 and 1 billion in 2010 will rise to 2.5 billion in 2050 and more than 4 billion in 2100,

Observing the possibility that due to poor soil conditions, inefficient cultivation methods and an insufficient water amount to cultivate enough crops, they cannot provide enough nutrition for their future population,

Horrified that the problem of starvation and the possibility of a vast increase of starvation victims is already apparent in African states with an increase of 92.3% in North Africa and 37.8% in South (Sub-Saharan) Africa from 1990 to 2010 with an estimated 232.5 million people suffering from malnutrition and the expected drastic increase of this number by the year 2050 caused by the rapid population growth,

Decides to provide agricultural aid from UN organizations to supervise the project of "Film Farming" in form of a special committee consisting of representatives of voluntary participating African member states;

- United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) to provide technological advancement by the use of the technology of hydrogel membranes, to build film farms in Gambia and other African countries;
- Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations (FAO) to improve the distribution of food produce within the countries.
