

Resolution presented by the delegation of

Bulgaria

Theme Sustainable development

Concern air pollution

The General Assembly,

Reporting that more than 40% off all garbage produced on this planet will be burned, releasing carbon dioxide/ monoxide, mercury and many other harmful chemicals into our air,

Troubled by the fact that people are not protected by clear and legal obligatory standards and that clean air is not considered a universal right,

Noticing that a big part of air pollution comes from vehicle tailpipes and coal fired powerplants,

Scandalized by the fact that air pollution has been responsible for around 7 million deaths by lung cancer, chronic obstructive pulmonary diseases and respiratory problems in 2017 (according to the WHO),

Decides that every country should recognize the global impact of air pollution and its damaging effects by considering clean air as a universal right, to lower the amount of harmful emissions and higher their standards to reduce toxic air pollution, by

- improving public transport and bicycle roads, encouraging the use of environmentally friendly modes of transportation and creating spaces for safe walking and cycling ;
- raising awareness through educational campaigns to educate the coming generation on environmental friendliness and sustainability ;
- implementing clean coal technology into our systems and subsidizing green energy ;
- using solid materials based on polyethylene, (a readily available and inexpensive polymeric material) in smokestacks to dramatically reduce carbon dioxide production.
