

Resolution submitted by the delegation of the Republic of Albania

Theme	Conflicts and international security
Concern	Status of climate “refugees”
Alarmed	by the constant increase in the number of natural catastrophes. For instance, only on the 13th of January, the tropical cyclone Cody constrained Fiji citizens to be displaced internally. But also by the rising sea levels, which endanger many countries, such as Kiribati, the Maldives, and even the Marshall Islands.
Deploring	the upcoming events predicted by the vast majority of the scientific community, which are a drastic increase in the number of these catastrophes, and a temperature rise on a global scale, which will lead to partial submersions of the territories mentioned earlier.
Reminding	that such a climate effect is not due to the local population’s actions. Yet, they are the most affected by these events and do not benefit from any help or have a way to get back on their feet after such disasters.
Worried	by that observation, worsened by the fact that it highlights the severe lack of legal bases that could help victims of climate change to face it, or at the very least, to find a viable life elsewhere, as stated in article 25 paragraph 1 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
Decides	<p>to modify the text of 1951 concerning refugees by integrating a new type of refugee, for climate causes, therefore establishing various ways of solving this situation and simultaneously the financing of these solutions as followed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Establishing areas, which will be recognised as being in a state of climate crisis. These would be areas that are under the danger of disappearing or areas that are too often hit by natural disasters.</li><li>- Internal migration solutions, in the countries that are still able to, in order to lessen important and uncontrolled migratory fluxes</li><li>- In the case, in which those solutions are not possible, the access to the asylum application process, in a country as close as possible, culturally or geographically speaking, hopefully as to reduce conflicts and separations.</li><li>- To suggest funding based on GDP, the global greenhouse gases emission, and the emission per citizen of each country. This calculation is aimed at being as fair as possible, by penalising countries that have and still are responsible for climate change. To further this measure, any lowering in the annual emission will make the total contribution of the country lower and will reward those who are making an effort.</li></ul>
