

Resolution presented by the delegation of

The United States of America

Theme                      Social and political rights

Concerns                      the rights of sexual minorities

The General Assembly,

Shocked                      by the high number of permanent UN members which continue to persecute LGBTQ+ minorities,

Stating                      that the declaration of human rights is one of the founding documents of the UN, and that the members of the assembly cannot ignore it without consequences,

Reminding                      that the persecution of LGBTQ+ people leads to suicide attempt rates four times higher than in the general population, and that these same individuals are forced to live reclusive lives for fear of being discovered,

Noting                      that many countries which still have barbaric practices against sexual minorities such as honor killings or imprisonment have access to international development assistance, including Syria and the Democratic Republic of Congo

Decides                      To create an international treaty recognizing the inalienable rights of LGBTQ+ minorities ;

- To prohibit the definition of homosexuality as a crime, and to decriminalize all LGBTQ+ relationships ;
- To limit access to development aid for countries that choose to ignore this treaty and continue on the path of intolerance.
