Theme A2030 Agenda for sustainable development

Concerning A global water management liberalization

The General Assembly,

Shocked by the global situation of freshwater scarcity, which affects a large part of the population,

Specifying that the scarcity of freshwater directly affects the access and availability of drinking water,

Surprised by the inaction of international organizations and many governments faced with this problem,

Observing that the current management of water systems is catastrophic in many countries and that the state and non-liberal measures to improve the situation proposed so far are ineffective,

Decides to ask for an international incentive to privatize the water systems in the form of a semi-public / semi-private partnership;

- to encourage the application of sanctions to countries that entirely refuse the privatization of water systems;
- to stimulate the imposition of strict international control over private water management companies in order to avoid any breach of human rights.
