

Resolution presented by the delegation of
Rwanda

Theme 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

Concerning The fight against the spread of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS)

The general Assembly,

Noting the continued increase in the number of people diagnosed with HIV to AIDS, in particular in 2020, there were 1.5 million new infections in the world and observing that the weakness of the means and organizations in place to address this growing problem,

Lamenting that more than 37 million people are infected with HIV worldwide, especially on the African continent alone where 25.3 million men, women and children have contracted HIV because of their standard of living and the lack school, health and medical infrastructure, particularly in Lesotho and Botswana, more than 20% of the population is HIV-positive

Shocked by the fact that millions of people around the globe do not have access to effective means of prevention as well as guaranteed access to emergency care and noting that one can live with this disease, particularly in Europe and that in some countries there is a lack of technology which increases the mortality of some infected people,

Appalled by the tragic African situation resulting from European colonization. The great Western powers have cleverly plundered Africa of its materials raw materials and its workforce for centuries without ever having built sustainable basic infrastructure,

Reminding that ten years after adopting the 1983 Resolution stipulating the “need of a coherent intervention by the United Nations to assist States members to deal with this problem”, the United Nations has still not done anything relevant to curbing the epidemic.

Decided

- To finally tackle the sources of the problem by increasing the annual budget tenfold of UNAIDS, which will allow this UN organization to move forward towards its main goal of ending the HIV epidemic by 2030 and providing technology to the countries that need it,
- To charge this amount to the former colonial powers: United Kingdom, France, Germany, Portugal, Spain, Belgium and Italy.
