

Resolution presented by the delegation of

Yemen

Theme Conflicts and international security

Concern Trade transparency for military purposes

The General Assembly,

Concerned about the harmful effects of the sale of arms on conflicts, the civil consequences and the increase in tensions in the world,

Considering the lack of transparency, in particular on the origin, the buyer, the price, the quantity and the means used in the trade of tools for military purposes,

Recalling that armed conflicts are often fueled by the trade in war materials, which unfortunately is not well controlled,

Believing that an increase in transparency would hold governments accountable and thus decrease the mass and intensity of wars in the world,

Accusing certain countries of enriching their economies by profiting from the deaths of thousands of people and of interfering in the internal politics of various nations,

Decide

- on the creation of a new organization linked to the United Nations: the OCCA (Organization for the Control of the Trade in Arms);
- the establishment of a new article in the United Nations Charter for more transparency on the sale of arms, in particular on the following points: the recipient, the supplier, the costs as well as the specificities of imports (for what means, what?);
- economic sanctions equivalent to the sum of the cost of the military equipment sold, if there is non-compliance with the previous instruction.
