

## Resolution 2: The State of Palestine

Theme : Political and social rights

Subject : The right to vote in the UN General Assembly

The General Assembly,

Recalling That in 2012, Palestine, then an observer, was granted the status of non-member state as well as the recognition of “state of Palestine” despite existing as so since 1948,

Noting with approval That 139 member states at the UN view Palestine as a country,

Regrets That Israel persists to ignore and deny the existence of a Palestinian state,

Further deploring That the current status of the State of Palestine does not allow the country to vote at the United Nations which is unacceptable and is a clear violation of the state’s rights,

Calls upon The United Nations and its members to allow the State of Palestine to become a full active member of the UN, enabling it to vote at the General Assembly. Palestine was given the status of a state by the UN in 2012 and should be able to act fully as so;

Decides That Israel and the 53 other countries that have not done so, are to recognize the State of Palestine like many already have as it is a matter of peaceful coexistence in the Middle East.
